William O'Brien and John Bell were charged with stealing a coat and two handkerchiefs from the cabin of the schooner *Union*, in the West Dock, the property of John Edwards, watchman. — Complainant said on Thursday morning he saw the prisoner O'Brien come out of the cabin of the ship, while the other at the same moment came on to the deck, and after asking for a light to his pipe, said he missed his companion. They both left the ship together, and on going down to the cabin complainant found that his bed and bedding had been pulled about, and his coat gone.—Robert Deans, dock constable, apprehended the two prisoners in a public-house. On Bell was found a handkerchief and a box containing 1s. 6d. On O'Brien he also found a handkerchief and two pices of tobacco. These several articles were identified by complainant as being his property, and were in the coat pocket at the time it was stolen.—Remanded till Monday.

Edward Morgan, William Richards, and Edwin Richards, three youths, were charged with stealing a quantity of pears from a garden in Charles-street, the property of Dr. Vachell. Two of the boys were found in the garden with sixty-two pears in their possession. William Richards was discharged, as he was not seen in the garden, and the other two were cautioned and discharged.

STEALING ROPE.—William Thomson, seaman on board the *Memphis*, was charged with stealing about forty fathoms of rope, and Peter Lee, marine store collector, with receiving the same, knowing it to have been stolen.—John Healerow, mate, said on Friday he was shown the rope produced, and at once recognised it as belonging to his ship. The prisoner is one of the crew.—Robert Deans, dock policeman, said about two o'clock in the afternoon of Friday he saw the prisoner Lee with the rope on his back. The rope was valued at 10s.—Thomson pleaded guilty and was sent to prison for one month; Lee was discharged, as the Bench did not consider the evidence complete.
