Spencer applied for a licence on behalf of George Ferris, Upper George-street. Mr Ingledew opposed, and presented a memorial in support from the inhabitants of the neighbourhood. The application was refused.—The bench also declined to grant a similar application made by Mr Spencer on behalf of Robert Dean, Tavistock-street; and a similar one made by Mr Ingledew for W. Armstrong, 28 and 29, Tyndall-street, which was opposed by Mr Spencer.—Mr Sherley applied for the transfer of the licence of the Castle Inn, Castle-street to a house
